This letter is in regard to our 8th Annual 'Drive Fore a Cure' Golf Tournament for TEAM Cure ALS Foundation. This year, the tournament will be held July 19, 2014 at Pumpkin Ridge Golf Course in North Plains, Oregon. All proceeds from the event benefit the Foundation and its commitment to treatment and elimination of Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) more commonly know as Lou Gehrig's disease. The average life expectancy for those diagnosed with ALS is 3-5 years, and every 90 minutes someone is diagnosed with the disease. There is no cure.

In 1998, after being diagnosed in 1996 with ALS himself, Mike Lopez established TEAM Cure ALS Foundation a non-profit 501 (C)(3), publicly-supported organization. The mission of the Foundation is to raise funds for research and patient services for ALS diagnosed patients and their families, and increase ALS educational awareness. Mike passed away in January of 2013 after a 17-year, courageous and extraordinarily hard fought battle. Mike was an inspirational hero and touched the lives of countless. Because of Mike's perseverance and commitment to the mission of his Foundation, TEAM Cure ALS has been able to provide educational scholarships for students with family members affected by ALS and contributed financially to numerous patients living with ALS.
